The 2015 Special Olympics World Games with 7000 athletes and 2000 coaches representing 177 countries—being staged in Los Angeles July 25-August 2, 2015 — was the largest sports and humanitarian event anywhere in the world in 2015, and the single biggest event in Los Angeles since the 1984 Olympic Games.

The Special Olympics movement was founded in 1968 and its mission is to create a better world by fostering the acceptance and inclusion of all people through the power of sport and empower people with intellectual disabilities to become accepted and valued members of their communities.

Four athletes along with the Afghanistan Special Olympic Representative, Mr. Abdul Karim Azizi represented Afghanistan in the Special Olympic Games 2015 in Los Angles and had tremendous achievements.


The Afghan athletes won 4 gold medals and 3 silver medals during the 7 day games.

The Consulate General of Afghanistan in Los Angeles held a reception in honor of the Afghan Special Olympic delegation on 4th August.








